CCNV History



Project Overview


Purpose: Redevelopment of existing Federal City Shelter into a comprehensive human services campus including:

- Administrative and supportive services space



Alley Lots Consolidated: 812, 813 (interior alley lots)

- Necessary for unified redevelopment across full site
- Alley closure enables connection of interior and street-facing lots
- Improves fire access, site safety, and internal circulation

District Alignment & Public Good


- Mayor's FY25 Budget: \$64M committed over FY25–FY27 for CCNV redevelopment

- Public Safety: 24/7 presence increases neighborhood activity and supports wellness-based safety










South Garage Entrance






Northern Alley




