3. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

MOTION: The Commission APPROVED (6 yeas – 0 nays – 0 abstentions) the agenda as submitted. (Motion by Commissioner Abu-Khalaf, Second by Commissioner Rogers).

4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

MOTION: The Commission APPROVED (5 yeas – 0 nays – 1 abstention [Commissioner Watts]) the Minutes of the September 2, 2025, November 20, 2025, and December 18, 2025 ANC 6E Public Meetings as submitted. (Motion by Commissioner Abu-Khalaf, Second by Commissioner Prince).

5. UPDATE FROM AND DISCUSSION WITH COUNCILMEMBER ROBERT WHITE (AT-LARGE)

Councilmember Robert White provided updates not only on the city's normal public safety challenges but also the large Federal presence in the city. He advocated for balancing accountability for violent crimes and a speedy court process with proactive prevention, such as youth mentorship and vocational training. As Chair of the DC Council Committee on Housing, he is also focused on affordable housing, strengthening tenant protections, preserving existing housing, and finding ways to create additional housing. Jeanne Mattison reported on the following topics: **(1)** poor living conditions at Museum Square Apartments; **(2)** DC Council appointment of Doni Crawford as Councilmember following the resignation of At-Large Councilmember Kenyan McDuffie; **(3)** DC Council Performance and Budget Oversight Hearings; **(4)** U.S. Department of Transportation proposal to ban DC traffic cameras. 7. UPDATE FROM MAYOR'S OFFICE OF COMMUNITY RELATIONS AND SERVICES (MOCRS) –
Noah Glasgow, Ward 6 Liaison

Noah Glasgow reported on the following topics: **(1)** the recent snow/ice storm and who to call/contact for snow clearing in areas that have not been addressed; **(2)** the Teacher Retention Rate in D.C. Public Schools and DC Public Charter Schools reached a five-year high in school year 2025-26; **(3)** the recently passed FY26 National Security Appropriations bill and funding allocations for the District. A question-and-answer period followed.

Lt. Gregory Archer provided a brief update on crime in PSA 102. A question-and-answer period followed.

- Commissioner Abu-Khalaf stated – **(1)** we should have an ANC Commissioner for 6E04 soon. He should get a notification from the DC Board of Elections next week; **(2)** there was an inquiry about grant applications. He will reach out to the OANC to see if they can provide a list of requirements, who is eligible, etc.
- Commissioner Prince stated the National Capital Planning Commission is leading a process called the New Pennsylvania Avenue Project that involves modifications of sight lines and protection of historic properties. He attended the first meeting of what will be a long-term project. More to come on this.
- ANC 2E Commissioner Kishan Putta, who also works for DC Health Link, reminded 6E constituents that Saturday, January 31, 2026 is the deadline to enroll for health insurance. Visit Ben's Chili Bowl, 1208 U Street NW, on Friday and Saturday, January 30-31, 2026.
- Commissioner Prince and Commissioner Carson will meet regarding the transition process for the new Treasurer.
